# **JULY LEARNING PROGRAMME (Y2-5)**

Thank you to those of you who have registered your interest in the JLP for Y2-5. Registration is now closed, and we are delighted to say that it looks as though we will be able to meet all requests for certain dates. It also looks as though we will be able to offer at least six days of learning to every child registered for the programme. We now need to digest yesterday's latest government guidance in order to ensure our risk assessment is thorough and comprehensive, which we will do over the weekend. Further details will follow, as promised, on Monday. This will include your child's confirmed pod, the name of the teacher(s) who will teach them and individual arrival and departure times.

# SUMMER HOLIDAY CLUBS AT THE PARAGON

This year we are delighted to announce that we will be offering most of our usual holiday clubs at The Paragon with the exception of the cookery school. In order to adhere to government safety guidelines relating to Covid-19, the clubs will be open to pupils at The Paragon only and will operate at a reduced capacity where a maximum of 30 children at Camp Teepee will operate as two separate pods of 15. The camps will run for three days each in July and August and children registered will need to attend all three days. Booking for all clubs will open on **Monday 6 July** and details of how to book will be communicated on Monday to all parents via email, when you will also receive information about the Summer Learning Programme. A waiting list will be held once the clubs reach capacity.



**Camp Teepee** will run from **22-24 July** and **18-20 August**, 9.30am - 4.30pm. Total cost for 3 x days £115 with wraparound available until 5pm.

\*NB current government guidelines stipulate that a child should not attend multiple holiday provision settings. If your child is attending the Summer Learning Programme on 20 and 21 of July, they will not be able to join Camp Teepee in July as we will need to maintain the pod approach that The Paragon is adhering to. This advice may change and we will keep you informed of any changes.

**Thursday 30 July:** 9am - 3.30pm, £40

Expressive drawing techniques using ink, wax resist and charcoal.

£40 per day, suitable for children from Y3 upwards. 9am - 3.30pm

Thursday 13 and Friday 14 August: 9am-3.30pm, £80

2 x day Introduction to Printmaking for children in Years 4 - 6.

Children will explore a range of printmaking techniques including, mono printing, working with stencils, styrofoam and lino cutting to create a collaged composition. This workshop will involve the use of sharp lino cutting tools.
