General Expectations

- To become more independent
- To take responsibility for their belongings (which must be named)
- To have increased ownership for their academic, sporting and personal development

Mathematics

- Children work in three sets for Mathematics but the same topics are covered
- The teachers will be, Mr Millar, Mr Guest and Ms Perrin
- Setting is based on formative and summative assessments. There can be movement between the groups

Mathematics

- We recommend pupils practise times tables on a regular basis

English

- We teach a wide range of units including, narrative, poetry and persuasive writing
- A revised spelling scheme has been introduced. The pupils will have weekly spelling/dictation tests and regular lessons. Spelling lists won't be sent out on the same day each week but are carefully into each teaching sequence.

English

Reading at School

- Children are listened to regularly during individual and Guided Reading sessions
- We monitor Pupil Planners and record our own comments too
- A class reading book is read to the children
- Children have library sessions each week

English

Reading at Home

- Discuss texts and books, make reading a part of your daily conversation
- Share books together and read with your child
- Listen to your child read aloud at least once a week.
- Use the 'Paragon Reading Bookmark' to help promote discussion when your child reads to you
- When your child has read to you, please record it in their Pupil Planner

Outdoor Learning

- Now included in the weekly timetable
- Please ensure pupils have in school:
 - Wellies
 - Coats
 - Hat and gloves (for winter)
 - ALL named

Homework

- 30 mins homework three times a week
 - Monday: English
 - Tuesday: Maths
 - Thursday: Spanish/ French
- At least 10 minutes reading a day plus spellings and tables.

DoodleMaths/DoodleEnglish

- DoodleMaths/ DoodleEnglish will be set as a formal homework on alternate weeks
- If possible, little and often is better compared to one 30 minute slot
- DoodleTables and DoodleSpell are also available
